You will discover how this Northern country, with extreme weather conditions, a population of only 5.2 million and a language spoken nowhere else in the world, manages to beat even the USA in economic competitiveness.

Finland encourages economic growth by successfully bringing together Government funding, private enterprise and academic research. By actively promoting business sector development, the Finnish Government has located some of the world's most important companies within tight physical areas, allowing them to grow through shared knowledge, information and processes. Big names such as Nokia are based in research parks, where they act as a catalyst for the success of innovative start-up companies.

The programme has been developed in partnership with InspireNation, a learning and research company specialising in best practice. It has been contracted by GONW to organise a series of special visits to overseas locations. These will provide inspirational experiences of innovation, entrepreneurship and business development, all of which are vital to your own organisation and its contribution to a thriving economy and society in Merseyside.

Eureka aims to inspire you by example, not by theory. It will show you what others have done by introducing you to the people who have led the way. By taking part, you will meet organisations that have a great story, you will also get to know cities and regions that have turned around from the brink.

Eureka will enable you to spend time thinking about the issues important to you, as well as giving you practical ideas to benefit your organisation. It will encourage networking and help to build new partnerships. And most of all it will excite and inspire you.

Why Finland?

Finland is ranked as the world's most competitive economy, spending 3.6 per cent of its GNP on research and development financing and innovation. During the last 10 years, it has specialised in high technology, particularly information and communications technology. The success of its ICT sector means that Finland's hi-tech foreign trade runs more of a surplus than any other EU country besides Ireland. In the early 90s this trade still showed a bigger than average deficit.

Through an emphasis on business sector development by the Finnish Government, like-minded companies have mutually benefited from their location within business clusters, learning and growing together.

Finland's success lies in science and technology alongside a high level of education and rapid internationalisation. The United Nations Human Development Report (July 2001) ranks it as the most technologically advanced country and attributes its success to, among other factors, the higher-than-average technological skills of the workforce.

Eureka will look at how Finland successfully combines Government funding, private enterprise and academic research. We will be visiting research and technology parks which provide the incentive for start-up businesses to develop innovative ideas, becoming part of the supply chain to larger companies.

We will introduce you to some of the most important Government institutions, research centres and public bodies responsible for the dramatic changes that have taken place in the country. You will be able to share their experience of the challenges they have faced and the factors behind their success.

VTT is the Technical Research Centre of Finland and the country's premier technical R&D specialist. With a turnover of €220 million and 3,000 employees, it works with over 5,000 national and international customers. It provides self-financed, technology based research, aimed at developing competitiveness and creating new knowledge and skills.

OTANIEMI SCIENCE PARK

LAURI YLÖSTALO (MANAGING DIRECTOR)

The Otaniemi Science Park acts as an incubator and business generator for 90 hi-tech tenants. It helps entrepreneurs refine their business ideas into successful ventures and it provides support from training through to venture capital investment.

TEKES

KARI TILLI (DIRECTOR OF TELECOMS AND ELECTRICS)

Tekes is the National Technology Agency for Finland, contributing to its success as the country's principal public promoter of R&D. It is the main public financing organisation for R&D and especially promotes innovative high-risk projects. Funded by the Ministry of Trade and Industry, its annual budget of €380 million supports around 2,000 projects and its clients include nearly all Finnish universities and research institutes as well as all international partners. It provides support in innovation, business planning and research.
